

I am proud to provide the inaugural edition of the Union Bay/ Fanny Bay Fire Rescue – 2023 Annual Report

This last year has seen some significant changes as Union Bay and Fanny Bay departments were integrated into a consolidated fire service area. This administrative change was initiated in July 2023. The Comox Valley Regional District implemented this initiative given Fire Chief recruitment challenges given the retirement of Chief Mike Smith. The consolidation was further recommended in the Comox Valley Regional District- 2023 Fire Service Review.

The amalgamation in its totality will take time to fully implement however priorities have been set to ensure continuity of emergency services. As with any large organizational change, there are always underlying challenges in developing effective new procedures, paying attention to individual department cultural differences, etc. Nevertheless, within the pursuing 5 months, I have seen so many examples of thoughtful collaboration and professionalism from the entire membership - both Union Bay and Fanny Bay Fire Rescue.

It is my opinion that the act of formally combining the membership has made us stronger -stronger fellowship (33 Members), more access to shared equipment/apparatus and greater diversity in training expertise.

The care and compassion that is shown to others through the work of the volunteer fire department has continued to be the driving goal across both communities and I look forward to building on this initiative.

This report serves to document some of the incredible accomplishments in 2023.


- Provide a rapid and professional response to a emergency






